League*

*Played a pivotal role in the
Defiance Campaign of 1952*

*Arrested in 1962 and
sentenced to life
imprisonment in 1964*

Imprisonment: Mandela's Journey


Spent 27 years in prison, primarily on Robben Island

Became a symbol of resistance against apartheid

Advocated for reconciliation and unity

Released from prison on February 11, 1990

Mandela's Presidency and Global Impact

Became South Africa's first Black president in 1994

Focused on dismantling apartheid policies and promoting racial harmony

Established the Truth and Reconciliation Commission

Won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1993

Promoted sports as a tool for unity (e.g., 1995 Rugby World Cup)

Advocated for gender equality and women's empowerment

Strengthened South Africa's position on the global stage

Advocated for human rights and social justice

Inspired millions around the world

Passed away on December 5, 2013
