
## Media Literacy or Global Mayhem?

## E29 Exposed as International Hacker Cult Training Gen Z for World Domination

The operation, cryptically codenamed #MediaOverload, was allegedly designed to overwhelm the global information infrastructure by creating thousands of Al-generated articles about pineapple on pizza, flooding Twitter (sorry, X) with existential cat memes, and triggering a meltdown at a nuclear plant — metaphorically and literally.
