

Street Art - The Democratization of Art

Definition: Art in public spaces, free, accessible to all.

Contrast: Traditional galleries vs. street art—who gets to see art, who gets to make it?

Examples: Banksy (Political Statements)

- Uses street art to critique power, capitalism, war, and social issues.
- His work is free and visible to the public, meaning anyone—not just gallery visitors—can engage with it.

JR (Large-Scale Community Projects)

- Focuses on giving visibility to marginalized communities.
- Example: Women Are Heroes—huge paste-up portraits of women on buildings, bridges, and trains to highlight their strength and struggles.

Why it matters: Gives power to marginalized voices, transforms public spaces.



The Importance of Collaboration & Community Art

Personal story: A project where community involvement changed the outcome - India

Why collaborate? More impact, shared knowledge, diverse perspectives, sense of belonging

My experience: The Lisbon migrant community project - Mouraria



Techniques for Scaling Up Designs

Different methods:

- Organic Grid method traditional, simple, accessible
- Projection expensive, accurate, necessary in some places
- Freehand for very experienced artists
- Use what's already in the wall as a grid

My approach: Whatever suits the place and time better

Challenges and tips: How to keep proportions correct, dealing with unexpected surfaces.
